This rate scenario has applied an annual Consumer Price Index (CPI) shown in figure 1, increase on all budgeted O&M expenses. If the CPI for any given year exceeds percentages in Figure 1, rates will need to be increased by the percenage difference. The proposed rate increases (see figure 2) will allow the system to maintain an Unrestricted Reserve of over 270 days of O&M Expense beginning in FY23. 25% of O&M for water and wastewater was built in for asset replacement cost. An average of \$120,000 annually was built in for Transfers to the General Fund

We are pleased to present the following proposal for Engineering Services in conjunction with the City of Trenton's (City) Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) agreement for the Schofield Septic-to-Sewer Conversion Project. CPH Consulting, LLC, formerly Mittauer & Associates, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the Engineer, proposes to provide services as described in the Scope of Services to the City of Trenton, Florida, the Client, for the fees stipulated hereafter.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Engineer will complete the Engineering Services outlined herein to prepare construction drawings and specifications to support a general contractor's activities to construct a gravity sewer collection system with one pump station and force main. The collection system will serve the existing Schofield Brothers Subdivision (connection of approximately 55 residential properties). The force main extension is anticipated to extend approximately 3,200 linear feet to a connection point with the City's existing force main network. The engineering services will follow the "Tasks" identified in the City's FDEP Grant Work Plan (Attachment 3). More specifically, the engineering services will include the following:

TASK 1 - PRECONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Under this Task, the Engineer will prepare engineering drawings and specifications for the construction of a gravity sewer collection system, wastewater lift station, force main piping, and abandonment of existing septic tanks, along with associated electrical work and related improvements. This work will include preparation of regulatory permit applications. A summary of these activities is provided as follows:

- 1. Preparation of plans and specifications for construction of a gravity sewer system, wastewater lift station, force main piping, abandonment of existing septic tanks, electrical work, and any related improvements to serve the Schofield development.
- 2. Preparation of an Engineer's Opinion of Probable Construction Cost.
- 3. Provide three (3) copies of final plans and specifications to the Client.
- 4. Provide on-site, above-ground field topographic survey information at the immediate area of improvements as necessary for the preparation of construction drawings and permit applications. As it relates to subsurface utilities, the Engineer shall perform a Quality Level C investigation in accordance with ASCE 38-02, Standard Guideline for the Collection and Depiction of Existing Subsurface Utility Data.
- 5. The Engineer shall obtain limited geotechnical soil data consisting of soil borings within the limits of the proposed gravity sewer and lift station areas. This work does not include specialized field investigations such as ground penetrating radar (GPR) or other specialty studies.
- Assist the City with the Florida Department of Health Gilchrist County (FDOH Gilchrist) Septic Abandonment activities. The installing contractor will submit final permit applications for the decommissioning of existing onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems (OSTDS).
- 7. Preparation of a Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Application to Construct Domestic Wastewater Collection/Transmission System.

TASK 2 - BIDDING AND CONTRACTOR SELECTION

Work under this task includes assisting the Client with the public bidding process that includes: a) advertising the project for construction bids by preparing and advertisement for bids; b) managing bidding document distribution to prospective bidders; c) maintaining a record of prospective bidders to whom bidding documents have been issued; d) issuing addenda as appropriate to clarify, correct, or change the bid documents; and e) preparing a tabulation of bids.

TASK 3 - PROJECT MANAGEMENT

This task includes construction and grant administration services during the duration of the project. More specifically, these items will include:

- 1. Provide standard engineering construction administration services, including the preparation of construction documents; attending a preconstruction conference; reviewing the contractor's material shop drawings; making periodic visits to the site to observe the progress of various aspects of the contractor's work; reviewing and approval of the contractor's applications for payment; processing change orders, if required; reviewing the contractor's completion documents and record drawings; and performing final inspection of the work.
- 2. The Engineer shall observe startup and testing of the Schofield Wastewater Lift Station.

The Engineer shall defer to the Owner for public records requests, if any, and will endeavor to provide project related records to the Owner to fulfill such requests, upon reasonable notice and reimbursement of reproduction costs in accordance with Florida Statutes Section 119.0701 as outlined herein.

- 1. Public Records, Florida Statutes section 119.0701. In addition to all other provisions provided in this contract, the Contractor shall also comply with the requirements of Florida Statutes section 119.0701 regarding public records. Specifically, the Contractor shall:
 - (a) Keep and maintain public records required by the public agency to perform the service.
 - (b) Upon request from the public agency's custodian of public records, provide the public agency with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in this chapter or as otherwise provided by law.
 - (c) Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the Contractor does not transfer the records to the public agency.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF TRENTON, FLORIDA; DESIGNATING THE CITY MANAGER AS THE ADMINISTRATIVE AUTHORITY TO RECEIVE, REVIEW, AND PROCESS FINAL PLAT AND REPLAT SUBMITTALS; DESIGNATING THE LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS ADMINISTRATOR AS THE RESPONSIBLE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICIAL FOR APPROVING, APPROVING WITH CONDITIONS, OR DENYING THE PROPOSED FINAL PLAT OR REPLAT.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 784, amending Chapter 177, Florida Statutes, was effective July 1, 2025; and,

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 784 includes provisions that conflict with and supersede the City of Trenton Land Development Code; and,

WHEREAS, the amended language of Chapter 177, Florida Statutes, requires a final plat or replat submitted in accordance with Chapter 177, Florida Statutes, to be administratively approved and no further action or approval by the governing body of a county or municipality is required if the final plat or replat complies with the requirements of section 177.091, Florida Statutes; and,

WHEREAS, the amended language of Chapter 177, Florida Statutes, requires the governing body of the county or municipality to designate, by ordinance or resolution, an administrative authority to receive, review, and process the final plat or replat submittal, including designating an administrative official responsible for approving, approving with conditions, or denying the proposed final plat or replat; and,

WHEREAS, the City Manager has been designated as the Land Development Regulations Administrator.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF TRENTON, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Designation of Administrative Authority to Receive, Review, & Process

The City Manager, or his/her designee, is hereby designated as the administrative authority to receive, review, and process final plat and replat submittals as provided for and required by section 177.071, Florida Statutes.

Section 2. Designation of Administrative Official Responsible for Approving, Approving with Conditions, or Denying

The Land Development Regulations Administrator, or his/her designee, is hereby designated as the administrative official responsible for approving, approving with conditions, or denying final plat and replat submittals as provided for and required by section 177.071, Florida Statutes.

Section 3. Expiration of Authority

The City Manager, as the Land Development Regulations Administrator, or his/her designee, shall retain the authority designated in this resolution until a new resolution or ordinance redesignating the authority is adopted. It is the intent for these designations of authority to remain in effect until such time when a new resolution or ordinance is brought forward to further clarify the impacts of Senate Bill 784 on the City of Trenton Land Development Code.

Section 4.	Effective Date
